

2018 BizFed Leadership Roundtable Series Uduak-Joe Ntuk, LA City Petroleum Administrator

The first Leadership Roundtable for 2018 kicked off on January 16th at the City Club with Uduak-Joe Ntuk, Petroleum Administrator for the City of Los Angeles. Ntuk began his tenure in October 2016 with a Council directive to strengthen the City's oversight of petroleum and natural gas operations.

In April 2017, the City Council directed the Petroleum Administrator to collaborate with Los Angeles County Health Dept. that both "should identify and explore implementation





of meaningful long-term

measures to address these concerns." The concerns relate to development of oil and gas wells, storage facilities and active sites within urban areas, specifically nearby residents.

Ntuk discussed one his biggest challenges is to modernize the Office and bring it into the $21^{\mbox{\scriptsize st}}$

century. With 23 oil fields of which 18 remain active in LA County, it is

imperative that there be a systematic checking of inventory and thorough financial audits of all oil fields, which hasn't been conducted in years. Ntuk believes creating a new process and incorporating new technology will be valuable in conducting these financial audits to





accurately capture all the revenues that should be collected and track the expenditures.

Another challenge is to oversee all Pipeline Franchise Agreements, which all will expire in June of 2018. Working with his limited team, the goal would be to create a transparent and expedited

renewal process, ultimately making this a smooth transition.
